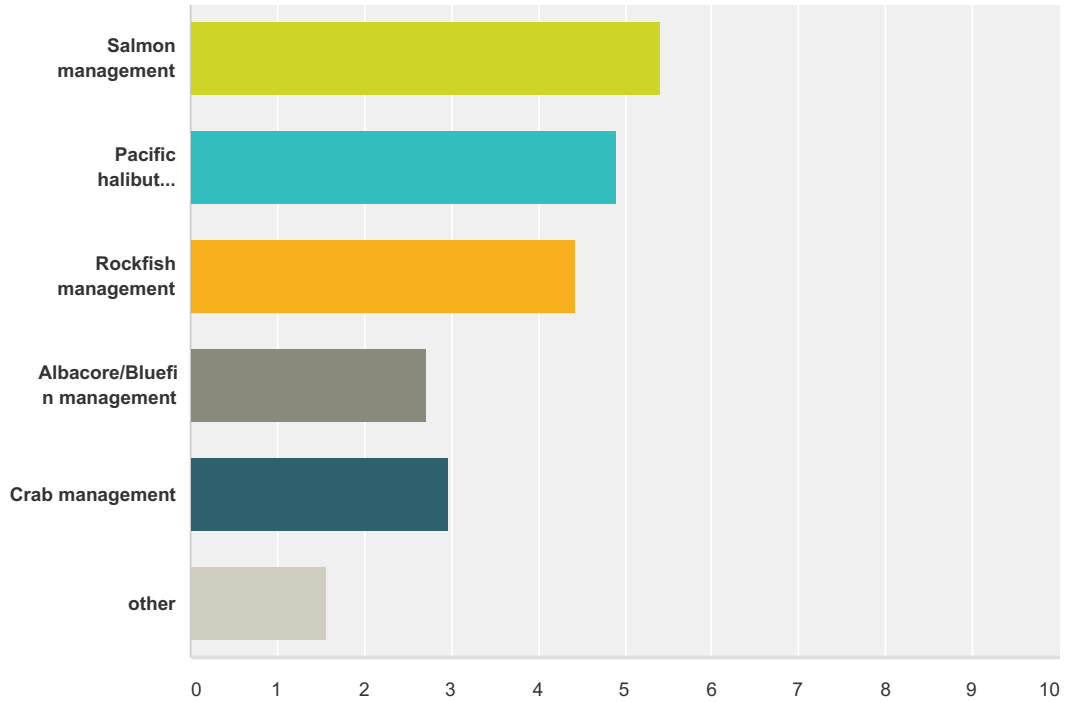

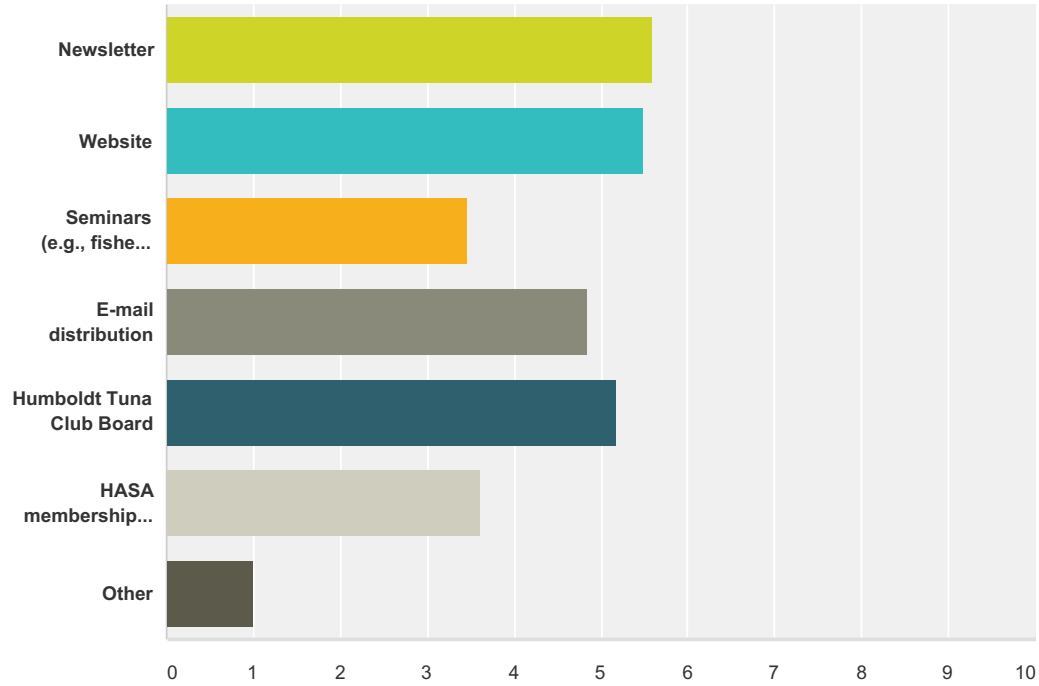

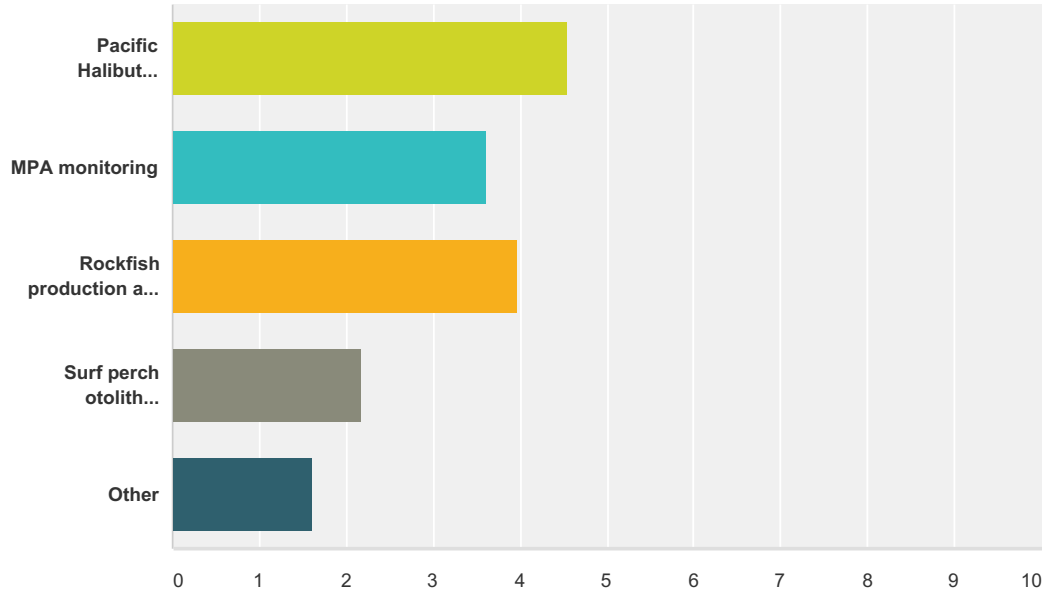

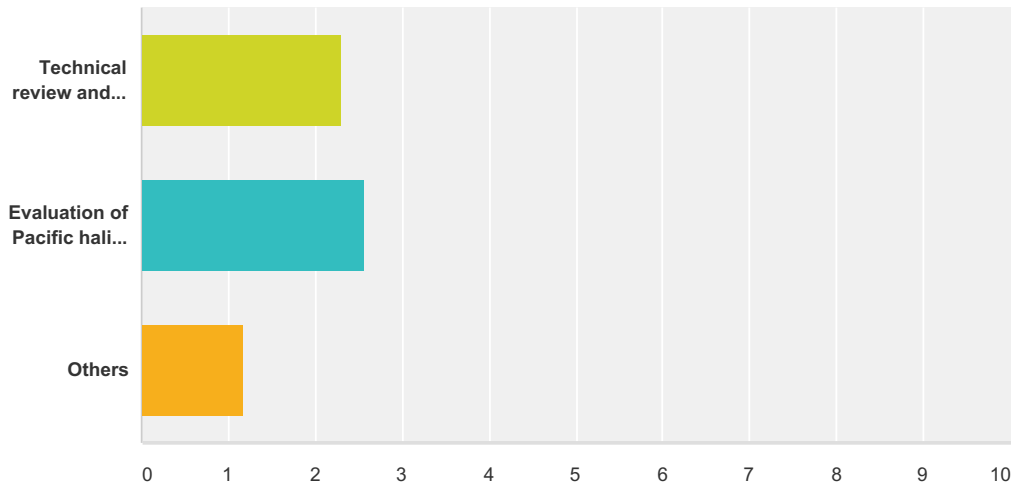

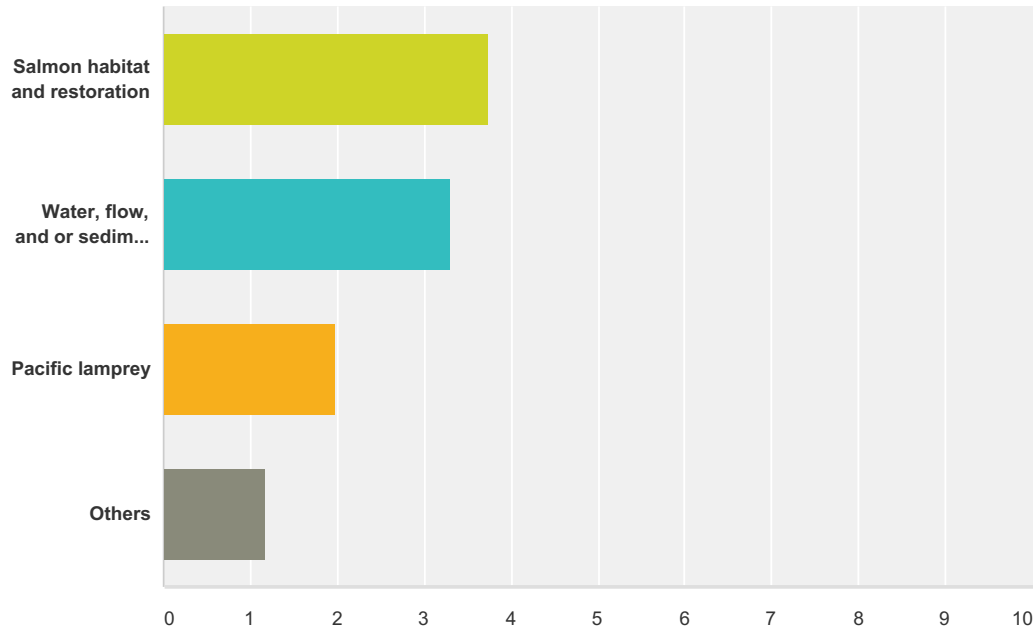

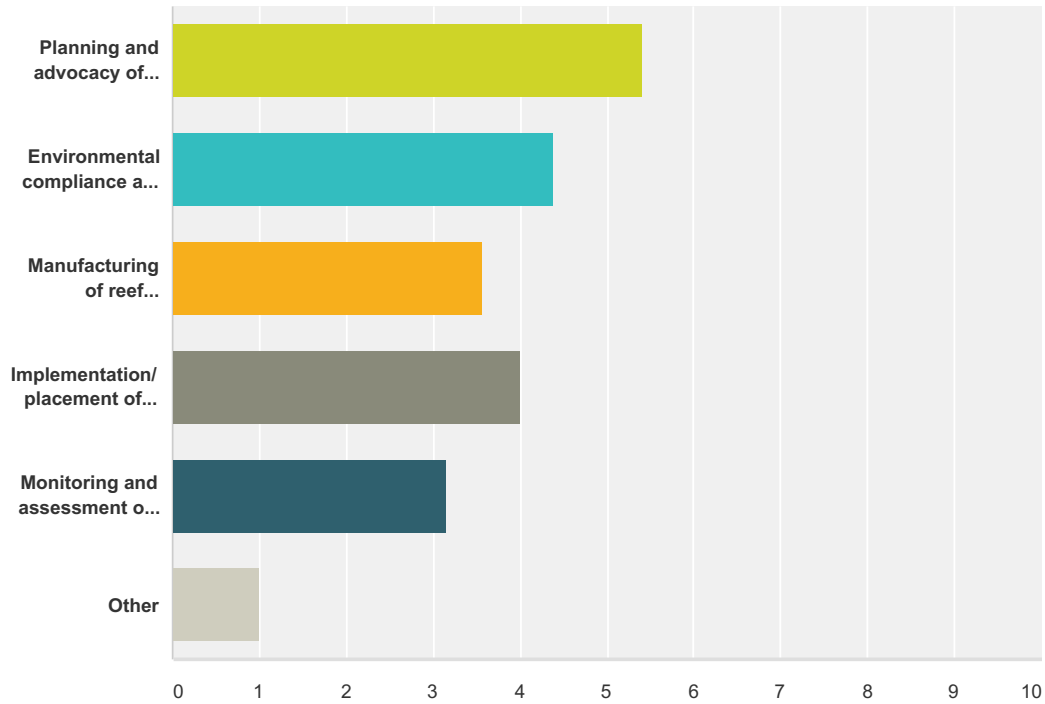

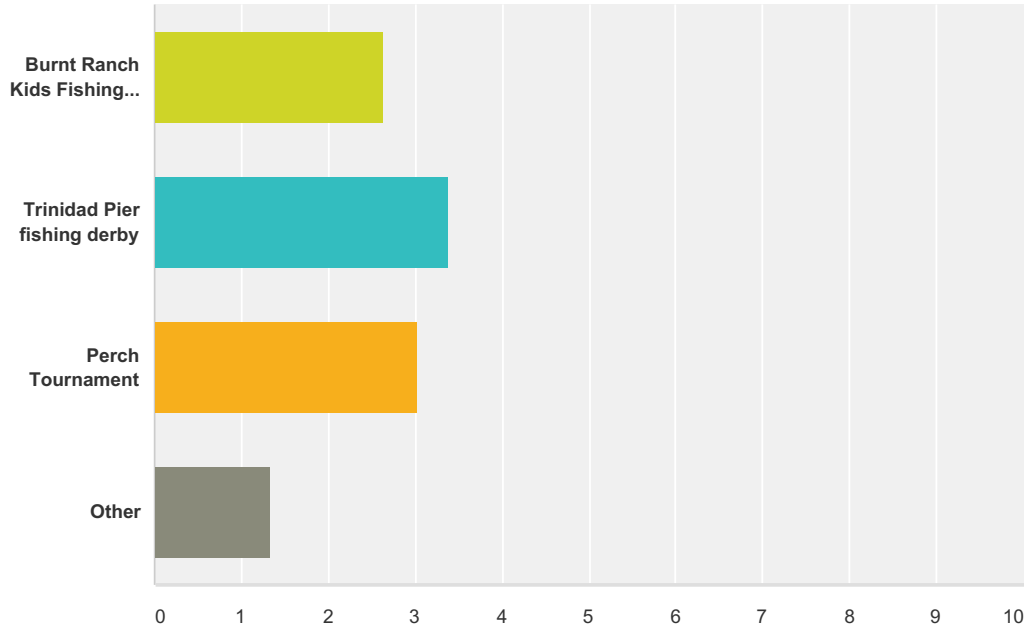

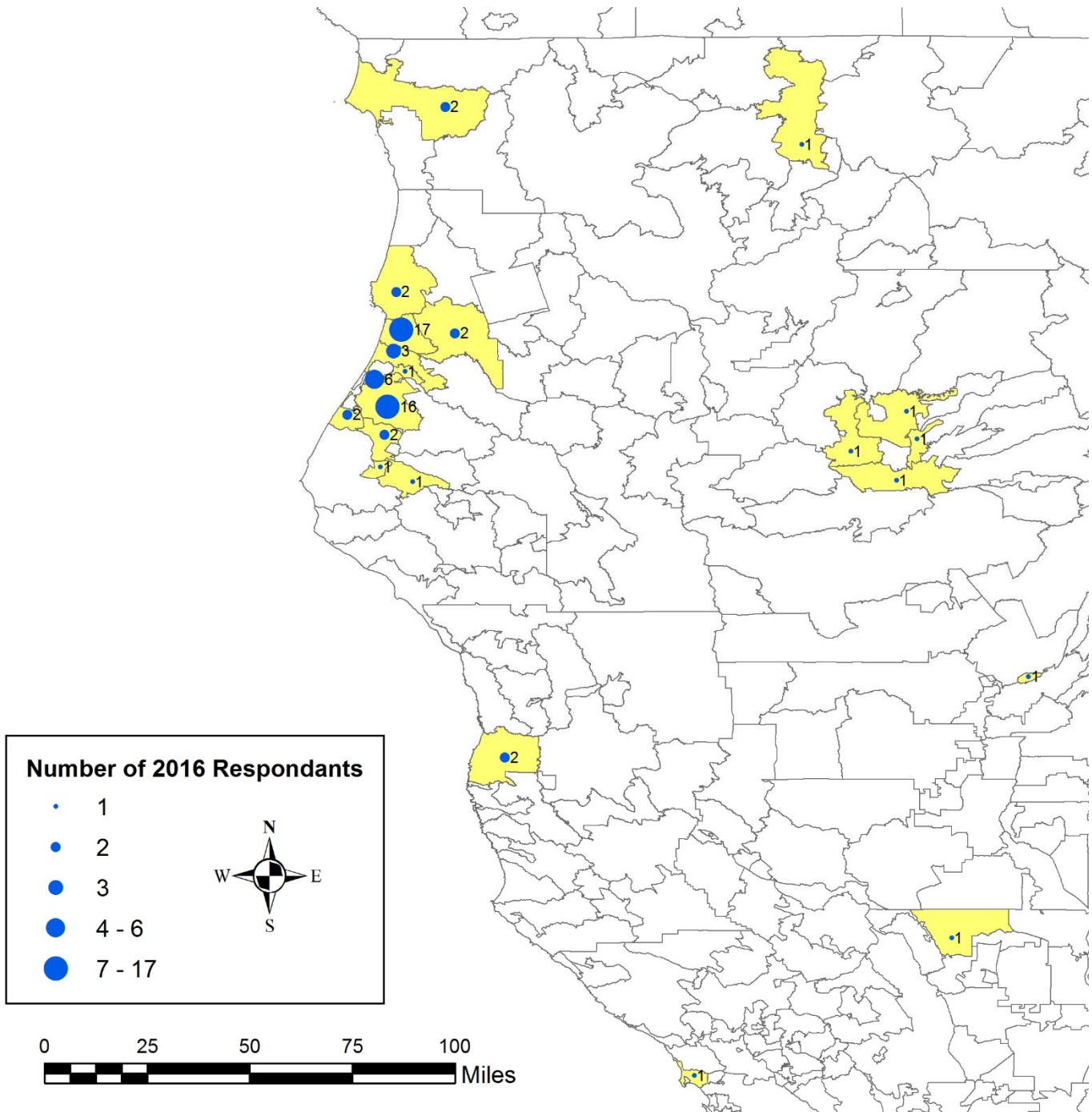
Q25: Are you a HASA member?

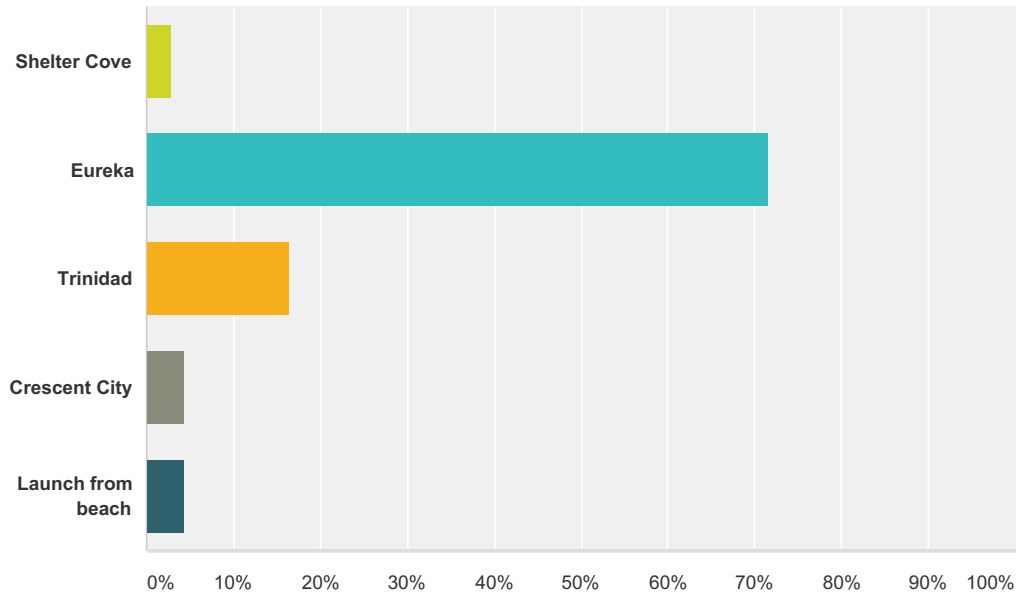
Q26: What is your home zip code?
